Our speaker this spring will be Brigadier General Teresa Djuric (USAF, Retired). General Djuric is the Commandant of the Virginia Women's Institute for Leadership (VWIL) at Mary Baldwin College in Staunton, Virginia. VWIL is the nation's only all-female cadet corps. Its mission is to provide young women the opportunity to develop the leadership skills, self-discipline, and strength of character which will be needed to be successful business and community leaders. General Djuric will speak about the program's goals, traditions, and cadet life. Since our scholarship essay focuses on the rights and privileges of Pilgrim women nearly 400 years ago, it seems most appropriate to learn more about the aspirations and goals of today's young women. BRIGADIER GENERAL TERESA "TERRY" A.H. DJURIC

(US Air Force, Retired)

is Our May Speaker



Brigadier General Terry Djuric (USAF, Retired) is the Commandant of the Cadet Corps for the Virginia Women's Institute for Leadership (VWIL) at Mary Baldwin College in Staunton, Virginia. General Djuric is responsible for the nation's only all-female cadet corps developing leaders and citizens of character and ensuring effective operations of the Corps. In addition, General Djuric works with key external constituencies (including the Association of Military Colleges and Schools of the United States, Reserve Officer Training Corps, VWIL alumnae) to garner and organize support for the program and assist in recruiting and retaining capable students, as well as maintains a close partnership with ROTC units for all service branches at Virginia Military Institute. General Djuric was commissioned in 1983 through Officer Training School. She has operated space systems at three space wings and Headquarters 14th Air Force. In 2004, she deployed to Southwest Asia as Director of Space Forces for operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom. She has commanded at the squadron, group, wing and education center levels, and has served on staffs at the Air Force Personnel Center, U.S. Pacific Command, Headquarters U.S. Air Force and the Office of the Secretary of Defense. Prior to her current assignment, she was Deputy Director, Space and Intelligence Office, Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics, the Pentagon, Washington, D.C.

Draft Minutes of the Virginia Mayflower Society's Fall 2015 Luncheon at the Commonwealth Club in Richmond, Virginia on November 21, 2015

Governor Mark Cox called meeting to order at 12:55 p.m. and welcomed those in attendance.

Elder Nancy Barrow offered the Invocation and Blessing.

Captain Bill Epling led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and the Pilgrim Pledge.

Past Governor William Paquette read the Mayflower Compact. Past Governor Betty Diakun shared the story of the "Five Kernels of Corn" while Past Governor Paquette displayed a poster of the Pilgrims that included a depiction of those who had died the first winter.

Governor Cox introduced those seated at the head table: Elder Nancy Barrow, Historian Beverly Berwick, Assistant Treasurer Rebekah Fleury, luncheon speaker Dr. Sydney Watts, Deputy Governor Lee Woody, and Captain Bill Epling. In addition to recognizing past governor Nancy Barrow seated at the head table, he introduced Former Governor General and Past Governor Mildred Ramos, Past Governor Dr. William Paquette, Past Governor Betty Diakun and Past Governor Martha Ellen Brockner who were also present.

Scholarship Chair Lee Woody announced that silent auction items to benefit the Mildred Ramos Scholarship Fund would be available for bids during the luncheon.

After a recess for luncheon, the meeting reconvened.

Governor Cox introduced the speaker, Dr. Sydney Watts, Associate Professor of History and WGSS coordinator, 1st year Seminars, at the University of Richmond, who spoke about the Huguenots - immigrants who played a very prominent role in the growth of Virginia.

The Roll Call of Passengers was read by Historian Beverly Berwick.

The minutes from the Spring meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Assistant Treasurer Rebekah Fleury reported a balance on hand as of September 30, 2015 of \$69,831, including \$13,238 in the Mildred Ramos Scholarship Fund and \$6,143 in the Memorial Fund. She reported that from October 1, 2015 through November 21, 2015 additional donations of \$1,191 were contributed to the Scholarship Fund and \$366 to the Memorial Fund. She also reported that 2016 dues had increased from \$28.00 to \$38.00.

Historian Beverly Berwick reported 18 new members since the Spring meeting - 16 by application, and 2 by transfer. One supplemental application was approved. One member has transferred out. There are 11 applications pending in Plymouth.

Junior Membership Chair Lee Woody reported a total Junior Membership count of 288, including 18 new junior members since October 2015 and 14 junior members who will age out by the end of 2015. Junior members in attendance were recognized and presented with gifts.

Mildred Ramos Scholarship Chair Lee Woody announced that information on the 2016 scholarship is available on the VA Mayflower Society website. She also announced the 2016 essay topic which is:

"Compare and contrast the rights and privileges accorded to the Pilgrim women upon landing at Plymouth in 1620 with their rights and privileges at the time of Plymouth Colony's absorption into the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1691."

Nominating Committee Chair Mildred Ramos presented the new slate of nominated officers. Each in turn was recognized followed by a vote. Nominations were also accepted from the floor.
