Message from the Governor

Happy Fall! I hope this newsletter finds you well and celebrating all that Autumn has to offer! This year's Fall Compact Day Luncheon Meeting will be held on

Saturday, November 19, at The Commonwealth Club in Richmond. Please be sure to send in your Luncheon Reservation Form as soon as possible to Miss Mildred Ramos. I look forward to seeing you there!

Our speaker this fall will be Dr. Christine Arnold-Lourie. Her topic will be the 1920 Pilgrim Anniversary. As we are only a few years away from the 2020 Anniversary Commemoration, I am sure you will not want to miss learning more about how our ancestors honored the 300th anniversary!

In addition, we will be holding our fourth annual silent auction before the meeting to raise money to help support our Mildred Ramos Scholarship program. Since 2012 we have provided talented and deserving students the opportunity to pursue their dreams of higher education. Our first recipient, Nick Aunspach, graduated this spring from Virginia Tech with a degree in mechanical engineering. Nick is a Junior member of our Society and a descendant of Richard Warren. With your continued support, we hope to expand the program in the future. The General Board of Assistants of the General Society met this past September at the Columbia Club in Indianapolis, Indiana. Our Society was represented by Lee Woody, Governor. Topics discussed included reviewing a draft DNA policy, ways to attract and retain members, and possible 2020 Anniversary Commemoration activities.

Finally, Pilgrim Robert Cushman's book, *The Cry of a Stone*, has been recently published and is available for sale. Cushman's book was first published in London in 1642. Editor Michael Paulick, states that this work is "the only known book written by a Pilgrim in 1619, close to the time of the Mayflower sailing." Members may purchase the book from the GSMD's online bookstore.

Dr. Christine Arnold-Lourie is our Fall Speaker



Dr. Christine Arnold-Lourie is a Professor of History and Coordinator of the History Program at the College of Southern Maryland where she has been a member of the faculty for 24 years and is a recipient of the College's Faculty Excellence Award. She has developed and taught a variety of courses, including classes in American History and Culture, Women's History, and the History of Race and Racism. Dr. Arnold-Lourie earned a BA in History at George Washington University, an M.Phil in American Studies at George Washington University, and a Ph.D. in American Studies at the University of Maryland. She is a co-author of *Pathways to History: Charles County, Maryland 1658-2008*, which was honored with the Maryland Historic Trust's Heritage Book Award. Her most recent publication is "Baby Pilgrims, Sturdy Forefathers, and One Hundred Percent Americanism: The Mayflower Tercentenary of 1920, published in Fall 2015 in the *Massachusetts Historical Review*.

Draft Minutes of the Virginia Mayflower Society's Spring 2016 Luncheon at the Holiday Inn Conference Center in Staunton, Virginia on May 7, 2016

Governor Lee Woody called the meeting to order at 12:50 p.m. and welcomed those in attendance, including first time attendees and guests.

Elder Nancy Barrow offered the Invocation and Blessing.

Captain Channing Zucker led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and the Pilgrim Pledge.

Governor Woody introduced those seated at the head table: Treasurer Richard Burke, luncheon speaker Brigadier General Terry Djuric, and Secretary Rebekah Fleury. She also introduced Former Governor General and Past Governor Mildred Ramos, Past Governor Mark Cox, Past Governor Betty Diakun and Past Governor Martha Ellen Brockner who were also present.

As luncheon was served Governor Woody introduced the speaker, Brigadier General Terry Djuric (USAF, Retired), Commandant of the Cadet Corps for the Virginia Women's Institute for Leadership (VWIL) at Mary Baldwin College in Staunton, Virginia. General Djuric is responsible for the nation's only all-female cadet corps developing leaders and citizens of character and ensuring effective operations of the Corps. She gave a brief history of VWIL and highlighted the sacrifices and commitment of the women cadets over the years.

The meeting reconvened with the Roll Call of Passengers, read by Assistant Historian Anita Walters.

The minutes from the 2015 Fall meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Governor Lee Woody and Mildred Ramos Scholarship Chair James Maloney presented the Mildred Ramos Scholarship to Hannah Wheaton, the 2016 scholarship recipient. Her winning essay can be viewed on the Virginia Mayflower Society's website.

Treasurer Richard Burke reported a balance on hand as of April 30, 2016 of \$76,729, including \$15,869 in the Mildred Ramos Scholarship Fund and \$6,547 in the Memorial Fund. During the 2016 fiscal year GSMD increased its dues from \$11.00 to \$15.00 per member. The VA dues increase from \$28.00 to \$38.00 helped cover the additional \$4.00 per member.

Assistant Historian Anita Walters reported 17 new members since the fall meeting including 1 new dual member and 1 transfer. One member

has transferred out. Three supplemental applications have been approved. There are currently 14 applications pending in Plymouth.

Junior Membership Chair James Maloney reported a total Junior Membership count of 299. Since October 2015 we have added 25 new Junior members to the Virginia Mayflower Society. Since the publication of the Spring newsletter we have added 4 additional Junior members.

Governor Lee Woody reported that the book "The Cry of a Stone," a rare 1600's treatise by Pilgrim Robert Cushman, has been published by General Society of Mayflower Descendants and can be purchased for \$30.00. Another article of note pertains to the 1920 anniversary of the Pilgrims' landing in Plymouth "Baby Pilgrims, Sturdy Forefathers, and One Hundred Percent Americanism, The Mayflower Tercentenary of 1920," by Christine Arnold-Lourie, published in the Massachusetts Historical Review. The next General Board of Assistants meeting will be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, September 8th through 11th, 2016.

Governor Woody announced that the next meeting of the Virginia Mayflower Society will be on November 19, 2016 at the Commonwealth Club in Richmond, VA.

Captain Channing Zucker added that he was impressed with the Virginia Mayflower Society's recently elected Board of Assistants and offered recognition of their accomplishments since assuming office.

Member Robert Garrett Jackson proposed that we submit a petition for a VA license plate recognizing the 400th anniversary of the Pilgrims' landing in Plymouth in 2020. A total of 350 applicants are required. Governor Lee Woody will explore the feasibility of his proposal.

Following the Benediction by Elder Nancy Barrow, the meeting adjourned at 1:55 p.m.

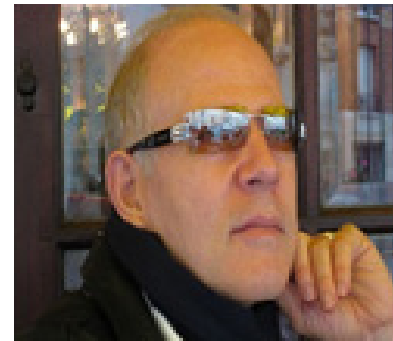
Publications of Interest!

In 2010 Dr. William Paquette was the Director for the National Endowment for the Humanities Grant “Plymouth, Massachusetts: Landmark of Pilgrims and the Wampanoag Indians,” which brought 50 college faculty to Plymouth for study and research. Two participants have achieved significant publications from participation in this Grant in 2015. Dr. Christine Arnold-Lourie, Professor of History at the College of Southern Maryland published “Baby Pilgrims, Sturdy Forefathers, and One Hundred Percent Americanism: The Mayflower Tercentenary of 1920” in the Massachusetts Historical Review, Volume 17, 2015. Kari Miller, Associate Professor of English at Georgia Perimeter College successfully wrote her doctoral dissertation at Georgia State University in 2015 on New England writer “Jane Goodwin Austin.” Austin knew Louisa May Alcott, Ralph Waldo Emerson, and Mrs. Frank Leslie. Her historical fiction centered on her Pilgrim ancestors and Austin was influential in shaping American myths about the Pilgrim story. Dr. Kari Miller is now writing a book about American Historical Fiction featuring Pilgrims.

ESSAY SUBJECT FOR 2017

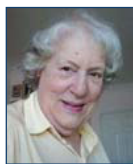
In 1620, 102 passengers sailed on the Mayflower with a crew of 30. During the crossing, one died and a child was born keeping the number at 102. During the winter of 1602/21 death plagued the Colony and only 51 passengers survived. By the time of the first Thanksgiving, Peregrin White was born bringing the number to 52. Did the death of many of the Pilgrims change the concept of family? If it did not change, how did the survivors embrace and raise orphaned Pilgrim children?

HOW TO APPLY FOR THE \$1,620 SCHOLARSHIP

By the March 15, 2017 DEADLINE, provide the Scholarship Committee with all of the following:

1. A brief resume showing academic achievement and community service.
2. Your sponsor must provide a letter setting out the name, address, telephone number/contact information for you and your sponsor.
3. A copy of your academic transcript for the current year and the previous two years.
4. An original essay on this year's subject of no more than 1500 words in the MLA, APA, or Chicago Manual of Style. The essay must cite a minimum of 5 print/web sources, but do not cite Wikipedia. Do use spell check or grammar check. Submit a hard and/or electronic copy.

Applicants will be judged on their academic record, resume, and, predominantly, on the essay.

Directions to the Commonwealth Club

The address of The Commonwealth Club, where our Compact Day luncheon meeting will start at 12 noon Nov. 19, is 401 W. Franklin St., Richmond, Va. 23220. Ample free parking is available in the club's own private lots adjacent to its building, as well as on the streets adjacent to the club, where the city's parking meter ordinance is not enforced on Saturdays. 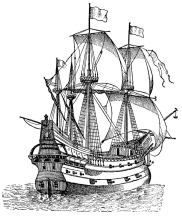
- From Washington, D.C. and Fredericksburg: I-95 South to Exit 76-B, Belvidere. At traffic light turn left onto Leigh Street. At the next traffic light turn right onto Belvidere. Continue south on Belvidere, then turn left at the fifth traffic light onto Franklin Street. The Commonwealth Club is in the second block on your right.
- From Harrisonburg, Waynesboro and Charlottesville: Take I-64 East to I-95 South. Take Exit 76-B (Belvidere), following directions given above. • From Norfolk, Virginia Beach and Newport News: Take I-64 West to the Fifth Street Exit (stay in the center lane as you enter downtown Richmond). Proceed 8 blocks, then turn right onto Main Street (one way) and proceed west 9 blocks. Turn into the Commonwealth Club's parking lot (black iron fence with “Commonwealth Club” sign).
- From Petersburg, Hopewell and Emporia: Traveling north on I-95, take Exit 74-A as you cross the James River onto the 195 Downtown Expressway. Take the exit marked Belvidere (pay toll). At the first traffic light, turn right onto Belvidere and proceed north on Belvidere to the third traffic light. Turn right onto Franklin Street and go two blocks. The Commonwealth Club is on the right.
